**ACCEPTABLE SOURCES:** Popular magazines or newspapers (Time, Newsweek, US News and World Report, New York Times, Wall Street Journal), criminal justice periodicals (in print and online through ProQuest), television documentaries.

**UNACCEPTABLE SOURCES:** Wikipedia, very short articles, reports of individual crimes, biographies of criminals or law enforcement officers.
